Sir Dieter Helm is Professor of Economic Policy at the University of Oxford and Fellow in Economics at New College, Oxford. He was Independent Chair of the Natural Capital Committee, providing advice to the government on the sustainable use of natural capital, until the end of the second term of the Committee in November 2020. In the New Year 2021 Honours List, Dieter was awarded a knighthood for services to the environment, energy and utilities policy.

He has written many books, most recently <u>Net Zero</u> (September 2020, William Collins) in which he addresses the action we all need to take to tackle the climate emergency.

His other books include: <u>Green & Prosperous Land</u> (2019, William Collins), <u>Burn Out:</u> <u>The Endgame for Fossil Fuels</u> (2017), <u>The Carbon Crunch: Revised and Updated</u> (2015) and <u>Natural Capital: Valuing the Planet</u> (2016), all published by Yale University Press.

Dieter has provided extensive advice to UK and European governments, including The <u>Cost of Energy Review</u> for the UK government in October 2017 and for the European Commission in preparing the Energy Roadmap 2030. He served both as a special advisor to the European Commissioner for Energy and as Chairman of the Ad Hoc Advisory Group on the Roadmap. He also assisted the Polish government in its presidency of the European Union Council.

Dieter is Chairman of <u>Natural Capital Research</u>, developing natural capital models and assessments for the better use of land, and Honorary Vice President of the Berkshire, Buckinghamshire and Oxfordshire Wildlife Trust.
